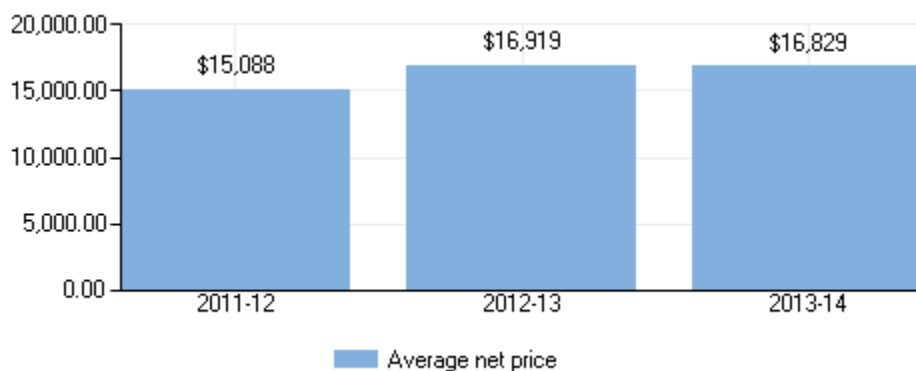

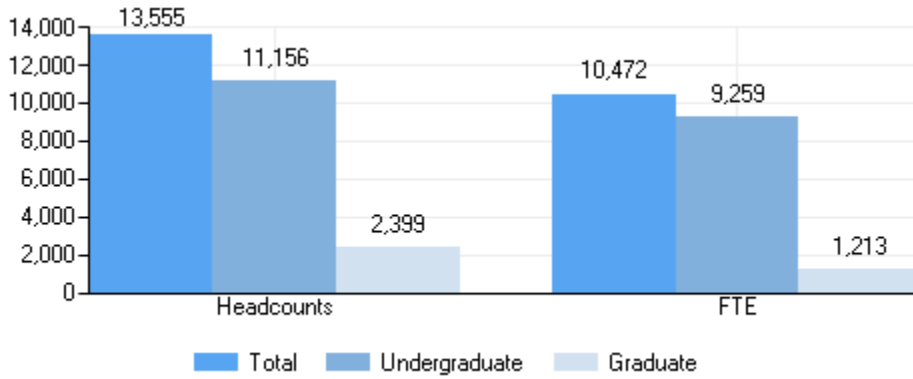

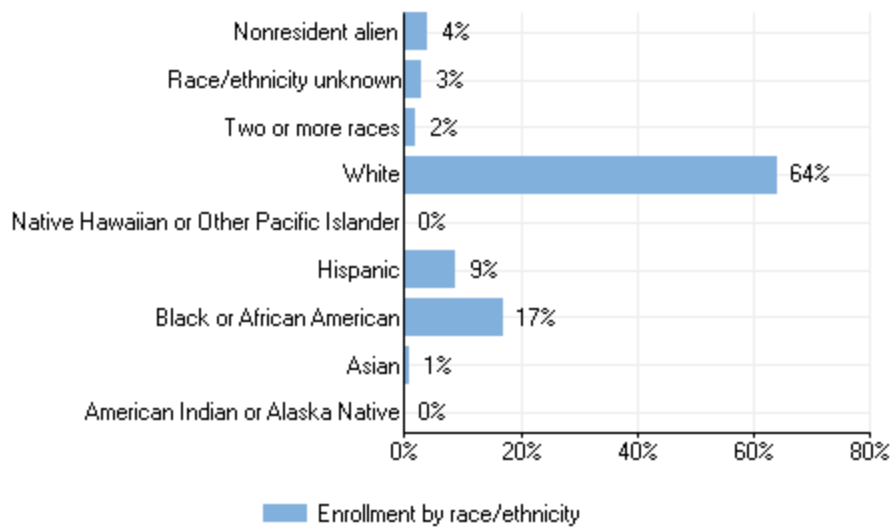
Unduplicated 12-month headcount and total FTE, by student level: 2013-14



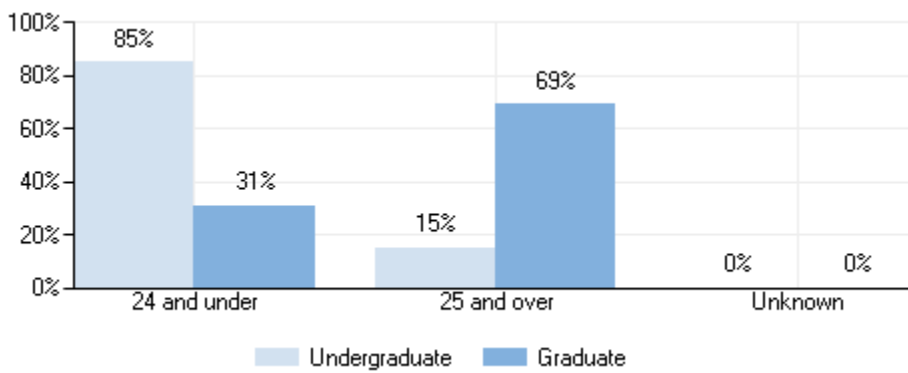

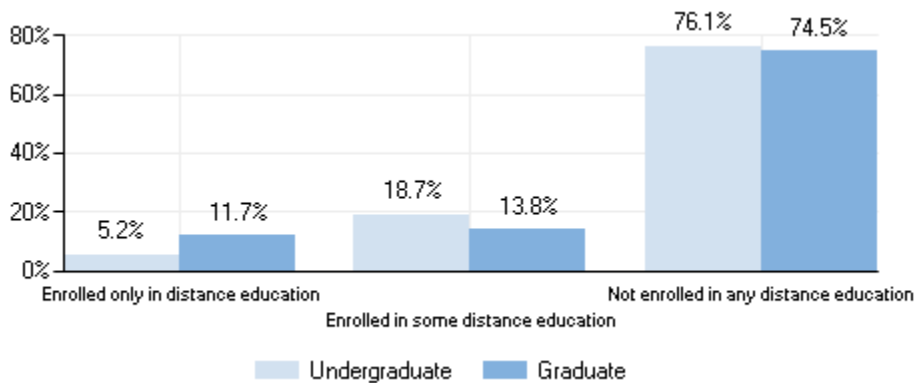
Percent of all students enrolled, by race/ethnicity: Fall 2014



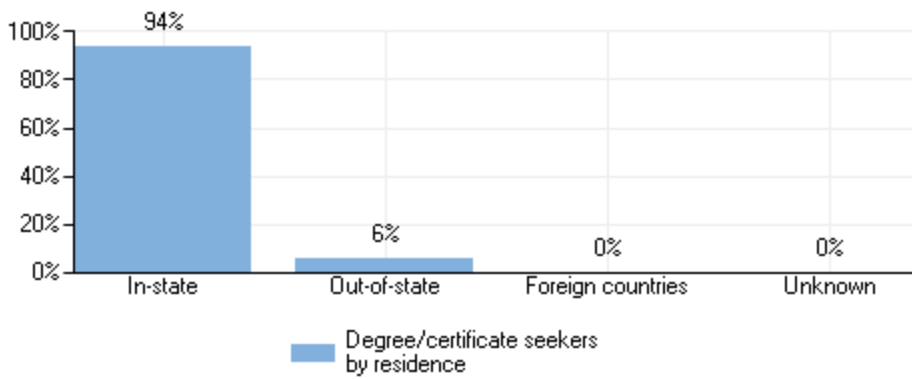
Percent of all students enrolled, by age: Fall 2014



Enrollment by distance education: Fall 2014

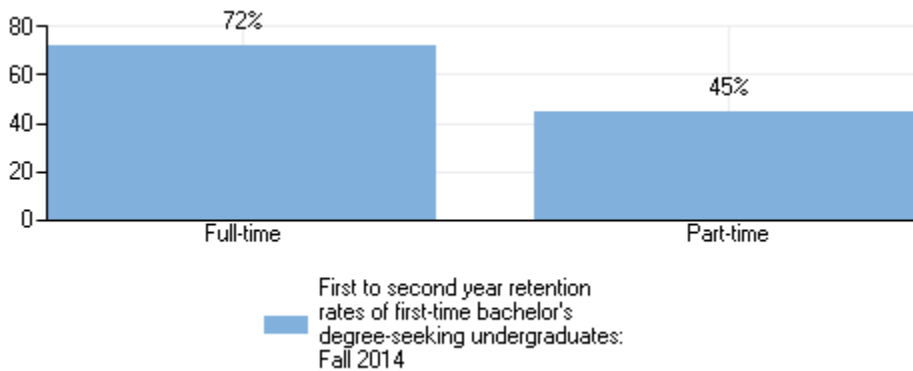


Residence of first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates: Fall 2014

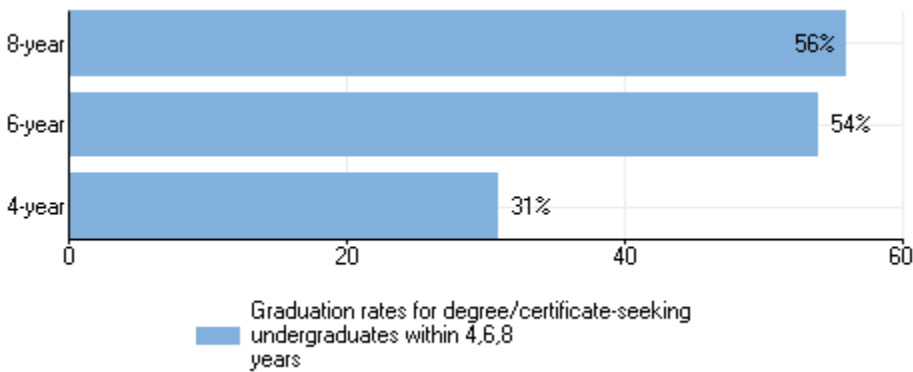

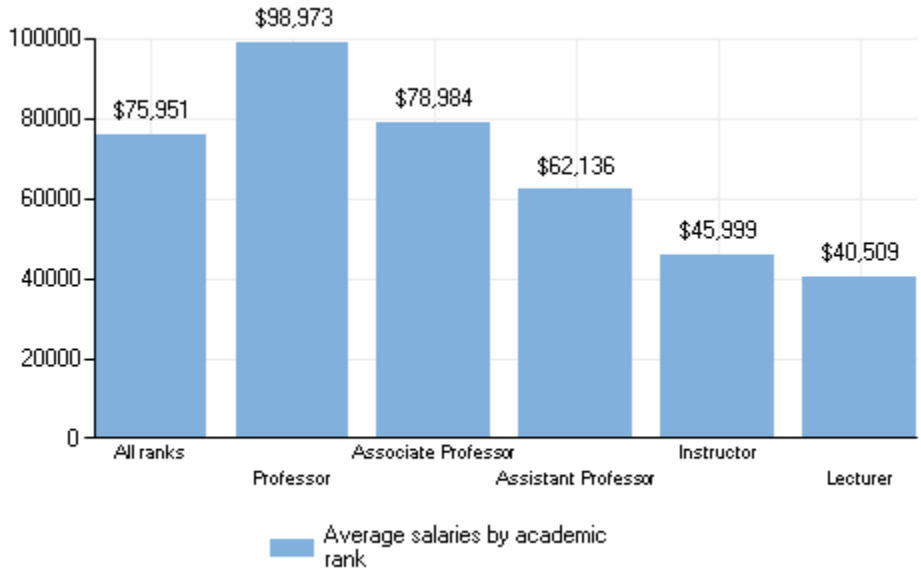

Average salaries of full-time, non-medical, instructional staff equated to 9-month contracts, by academic rank: Academic year 2014-15

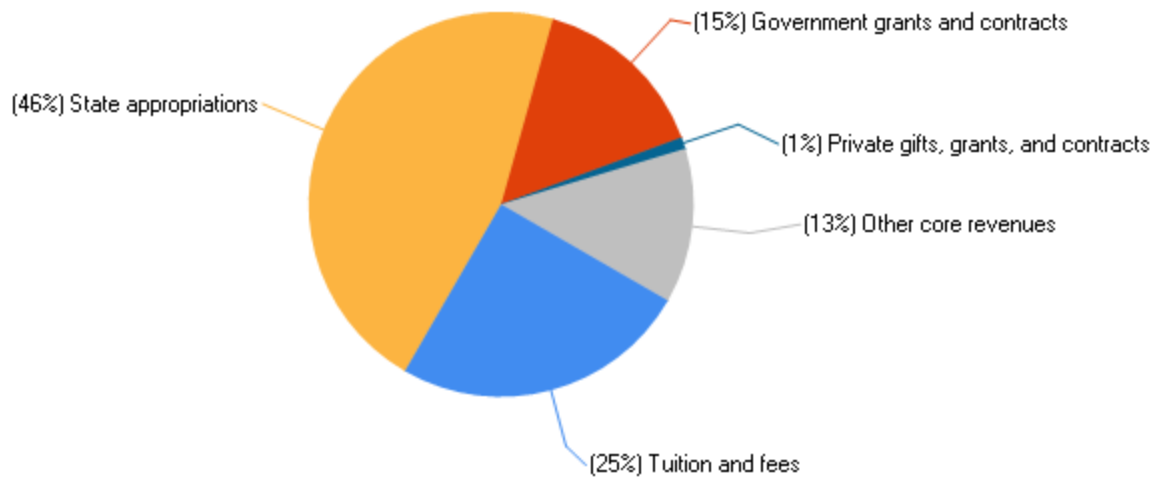

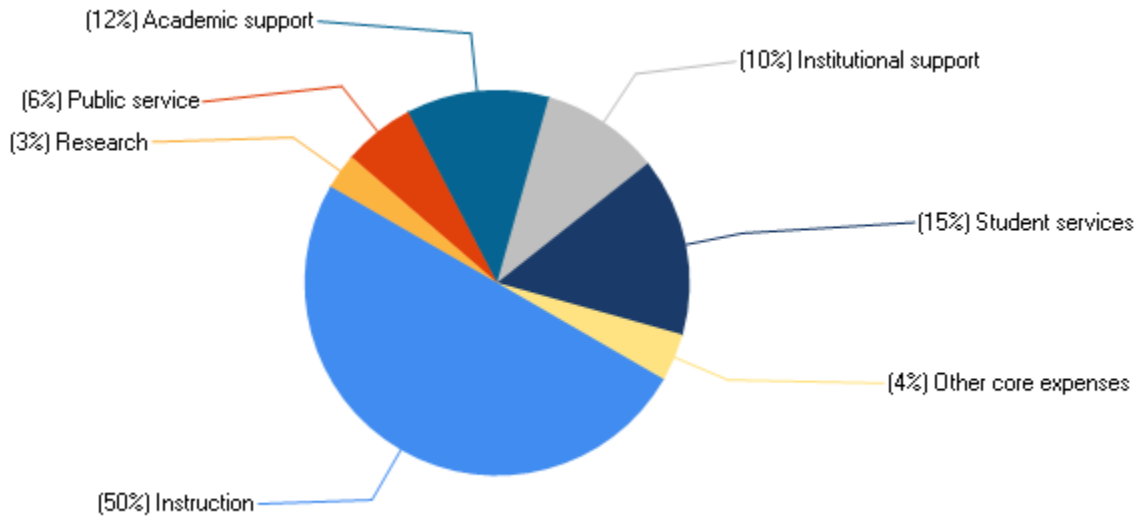
Percent distribution of core revenues, by source: Fiscal year 2014
