Re: November 2010 Strategic Plan Update

This month's *Strategic Plan Update* provides data from Military Times EDGE magazine and the Washington Monthly to show that the University continues to successfully pursue the vision of *Higher Values in Higher Education* to be the leader in educational quality, opportunity, and affordability among its peers.

Military Times EDGE magazine

Western Illinois University was selected as a "Best for Vets College" by *Military Times EDGE* magazine. Western ranked 25th, is one of only two Illinois public institutions in the top 25, and is one of only 101 national colleges and universities to receive recognition. Institutions were compared in four categories, with each category rated on a five-point scale. Definitions used by Military Times appear below.

- **"Financial Assistance**: Scholarships, discounts and waivers specifically for veterans and their dependents, including the Yellow Ribbon program and relaxed residency restrictions for in-state tuition; policies to protect veterans in case of late-arriving benefits.
- Academic Flexibility: Participation in the Service members' Opportunity Colleges consortium and Degree Network Systems and acceptance of military learning and subject tests, like the College Level Examination Program, for academic credit. Also school policies on military-related withdrawals.
- **Campus Culture**: Percentage of vets in the student body and faculty, ROTC programs, Veterans Day observance, local student veteran organizations and training for faculty and staff in veterans issues.
- **Support Services**: Number and kind of staff designated to work with veterans, including the number of students receiving work-study allowances from the Veterans Affairs Department. Also: efforts to reach out to veterans, acclimate them to campus and create a veterans' community, including mentorship programs, special orientation sessions, service projects and academic support."

The 2010 Washington Monthly College Rankings ranked Western Illinois University 131st of out of 551 national masters granting institutions for advancing social mobility, research and service. This places Western in the top 24 percent of all institutions selected for this honor. Definitions used by Washington Monthly appear below, and all three categories received equal weighting in the combined ranking system.

Social Mobility is a combined ranking based on the percentage of students receiving Pell Grants and the difference between the University's predicted and actual graduation rates, based on incoming SAT equivalent scores and Pell Grant percentages.

Research is a combined ranking based on total research expenditures and the number of bachelor's degree recipients who go on to receive Ph.D.s, relative to institutional size.

Service is a combined ranking based on three subsets: (1) the number of alumni who go on to serve in the Peace Corps, percentage of students who serve in ROTC, and the percentage of funds from federal work-study that is applied to community service, and (2) a combined measure of the number of students participating in community service and the total number of service hours performed; and (3) a measure on the number of staff supporting community service, the number of courses that incorporate community service, and institutional scholarships supporting community service.

The University ranked highest in the percentage of students who serve in ROTC (ranked 20th) and the percent of federal work-study applied to community service (ranked 33rd). All of the Macomb Campus benchmark institutions were included in the rankings. Three of the Quad Cities benchmark institutions were in the rankings. Western had the highest ranking of these peers. No other Illinois public universities besides those displayed below were included in the rankings.
