FY 19 SBDC OUTCOMES TO DATE:

- 400+ clients served in Macomb and the Quad Cities
- Assisted businesses securing \$2.2 Million in loans
- Helped retain or create112 jobs

3.1 ENGAGE EMPLOYERS: GREAT RIVER TEACHERS CORPS





Doguiromonto

- ACT Composite score of 22 (minimum score of 19 on the writing portion) OR SAT Composite score of 1110 (based on reading and writing + mathematics=1110) and minimum of 26 on the Writing and Language
- Essay on value of rural and small schools
- Endorsement from a rural or small school superintendent who agrees to interview the applicant
- Commit to teach in a rural or small school for at least three years after receiving teaching license/certificate



As a Corps member

YOU COMMIT TO:

Attend at least three selected seminars each year on rural and small school education issues

Graduate and become certified/licensed to teach


Complete student teaching in a rural or small school

Attend the Great River Teacher Corps gatherings held each spring
Teach for three years in a rural community within 22 specified counties

ABOUT

The purpose of the Great River Teacher Corps is to encourage and support enthusiastic students to become educators in rural communities. Applicants must commit to feaching for three years in rural or small town communities in the Western Illinois 22 county region (see map on back).





- Supported two scholarships for students north of McDonough County and three scholarships for students south of the county
- Will award 7, \$8,000-\$14,000 scholarships next year.
- Students in 22 counties are eligible to apply

3.1 ENGAGE EMPLOYERS: SCHOOL SAFETY



- Received a \$1M grant from the Department of Justice for Threat Assessment Training in K-12 Schools
- Staff will deliver a train the trainer model
- And work with every Regional Office of Education in Illinois
- Trainings will begin in 2020
