The application deadline for the spring GH 299 that will travel to Nicaragua over spring break is today (Friday, October 11). The focus of the course will be intercultural competence through studying abroad. The costs for the travel portion of the course will be approximately \$3,090. The first step in registering for this course is to apply online at http://www.wiu.edu/international\_studies/study\_abroad/. The second step is to pay a deposit of \$255 to WIU by November 1, and a deposit of \$500 to FSD by November 15. The remaining balance will be due on January 31.



However, you should always check with your academic advisor before withdrawing from a course.
