

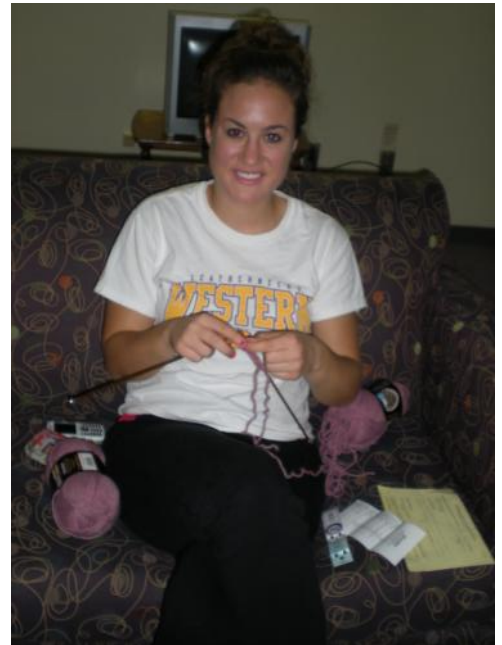

Daylight Saving Time Ends Sunday Morning

Daylight Saving Time ends at 2am this Sunday, November 1. Remember to "fall back" and set your clocks back one hour Saturday night or Sunday morning. That means you can sleep an extra hour on Sunday!

Last Day to Withdraw Sunday, STARS unavailable 6-8pm Sunday!

Sunday, November 1 is the last day to withdraw from a regular 16 week course. Because University Technology has to change the clocks that day for Daylight Saving Time, STARS will be unavailable from 6-8pm that day, so if you need to withdraw from a class, try to do it before 6pm. Remember that if you withdraw from a course at this point, you won't get your money back and it will remain on your transcript with a "W" grade. However it won't count toward your GPA. You can withdraw from a course yourself on STARS, but you should always check with your advisor first. After Sunday, you can't withdraw from a regular 16 week course without going through a complicated appeal process.

Study Abroad in the Lake District Spring Break
