

**WESTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY
NON-POLICE CRIME REPORT FORM**

This form is for the reporting of crime to assist with the compilation of statistical records. These statistics are required by Federal law, the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act. The crimes of arson, criminal homicide, manslaughter, sexual assault, robbery, burglary and motor vehicle theft must be documented if they have been reported to local police agencies or to any official of the institution who has significant responsibility for student and campus activities. Some examples of a campus official are deans, directors, coaches, housing directors, and faculty advisors for student groups. Please also understand that the law does not require professional or pastoral (religious) counselors to violate their duty of confidentiality to a patient by filling out a report. Please fill out the form to the best of your ability and forward it to the Director of Public Safety, Mowbray Hall, in a sealed envelope. In addition, this information may be used to develop effective crime prevention and intervention plans.

DEFINITIONS

ARSON - Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER - The killing of another person through gross negligence.

MURDER/NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER - The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

FORCIBLE SEX OFFENSES - Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that persons will; or not forcibly or against the persons will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.

NON-FORCIBLE SEX OFFENSES - Unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse (incest, statutory rape).

ROBBERY - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT - An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife or other weapon is used which could or probably would result in a serious potential injury if the crime were successfully completed.

BURGLARY - The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. For reporting purposes this definition includes: Unlawful entry with attempt to commit a larceny or a felony; breaking and entering with intent to commit a larceny; housebreaking, safecracking; and all attempts to commit any of the aforementioned.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT - The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. (Classify as motor vehicle theft all cases where persons not having lawful access take automobiles, even though the vehicles are later abandoned.)
