Program of Study

Western Illinois University–Quad Cities' Management department has a proud tradition of achievement and is ever building on its strong reputation. Undergraduate students can earn a Bachelor of Business (BB) degree in Management or in Human Resource Management and can take courses in Business Law and Operations Management. Graduate students can earn a Master of Business Administration (MBA) degree with a concentration in Management.

Faculty in the Management department work together to integrate global, ethical, critical-thinking, communication, teamwork, and multicultural skills throughout the curriculum; to provide opportunities for faculty/student research collaboration; and to effectively utilize the expertise of senior faculty members to mentor junior faculty in teaching, research, and professional service.

Faculty

The faculty in the Department of Management are outstanding educators, renowned for innovative and effective instruction, scholarly research, and service activity. They prepare graduates for positions of responsibility in business, government, and industry by focusing on teaching and student involvement in learning, scholarly research, and professional and community service. Faculty members use computer simulations; make extensive use of teams, cases, and research projects; stress improvement and classroom experimentation; focus on a valued-added philosophy to enhance students' career preparation; and maintain websites to allow students access to course syllabi, regular announcements, assignment details, daily session outlines, *PowerPoint* slides, and links to relevant external websites. International issues are covered across the Department of Management's entire curriculum.

The faculty excel in the area of research and scholarly activity. Their works include books, textbooks, chapters in books, journal articles, conference proceedings, conference presentations, and more. Faculty members continue to strive to remain current in their teaching fields through involvement in workshops, conference attendance, research, and engagement with practitioners' associations. Many faculty are actively involved in international studies in countries such as Russia, China, Mexico, Canada, Bolivia, India, and several European countries.

Honors in Management

To be eligible for the Centennial Honors College, entering freshmen must have an ACT composite score of at least 28 OR have a 26 or 27 composite ACT and be in the top 15% of their graduating class OR have an ACT composite score of at least 24 and be in the top 10% of their high school graduating class. Transfer students with at least 12 semester hours (SH) and up to 59 SH of undergraduate courses are admitted with a GPA of at least 3.3 OR 3.4 for 60 SH or more. Graduates with degrees in Management can go on to an almost boundless variety of careers in all economic sectors (public, private, not-for-profit), in organizations of any size (from small businesses to the world's largest multinational corporations), at all levels of responsibility (from entry-level professional jobs to top executive positions), in every kind of organization (including manufacturing, retail, consulting, health care, financial services, legal services, education, transportation, public utilities, education, and much more), and in any field of management (strategic planning, organizational change and development, project management, operations management, international management, and more). The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (www.bls.gov) projects more than a 12% increase in management occupations for the ten-year period between 2002 and 2012.
