

GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration: Enrollment is limited to 20 students who are admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. The full \$165 commuter registration fee includes tuition, supplies, all activities, transportation and lunches. **Registration forms, with payment information, can be completed online at wiu.edu/sao/outreach/youth_enrichment/youthmain.php, mailed to Study Abroad & Outreach, Horrabin Hall 8, Western Illinois University, 1 University Circle, Macomb, IL 61455, or faxed to (309) 298-2226. Checks should be made payable to Western Illinois University.**

Payment: The full commuter fee is \$165. Parents who wish to use a Payment Plan may send a \$100 deposit at the time of registration. Full payment is due 30 days before the start of the program.

Refund Policy: WIU reserves the right to withdraw a program because of unforeseen circumstances or insufficient enrollment. If a program is withdrawn, participants will be notified and fees will be refunded. A \$50 fee will be charged to participants who cancel after Monday, May 15, 2017. **No refunds will be made on or after Monday, May 29, 2017.**

Location: The program is a commuter program on the WIU-Macomb campus. Classes are held both on and off campus and meet Monday-Friday.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Do you want to film your own "Farm Report" in a complete broadcast television studio? Learn how to extract your own DNA? Make a ball out of sheep fiber you sheared? Or learn what a two-inch rainfall does to the dirt beneath your feet? This summer, fourth through eighth graders are invited to spend five days in the world of agricultural science. Western Illinois University's School of Agriculture has partnered with the Office of Study Abroad and Outreach, University of Illinois Extension and the McDonough County Farm Bureau to provide this exciting opportunity.

ACTIVITIES WILL INCLUDE:

Animal Science and Education: Program introduction by School of Agriculture Director Andy Baker. A visit to the WIU Livestock Center and a lesson on sheep fiber creations.

Hydrology: Rainfall simulator demonstration by Joel Gruver and Steve Bennett. Visit to the McDonough County 4-H grounds.

Commercial Agriculture: Visit to the University of Illinois (U of I) Northwestern Illinois Agricultural Research and Demonstration Center, Monmouth, IL.

Horticulture, Plant Breeding and Genetics: Lesson in horticulture with Chris Enroth. DNA extraction, GMO product testing and tissue culture with Win Phippen.

Agricultural Reporting: Filming and showing of Farm Report in the University Television studio.

PARTICIPATION CRITERIA

Program is open to students in grades fourth through eighth who are admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. Enrollment is limited to 20 students, so register early.

SPECIAL FEATURES

Top faculty from WIU's School of Agriculture, Department of Geology, University Television, coordinate the instructional portion of the program. Participants experience interactive exposure to the University environment with hands-on activities.
