

GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration: Enrollment is limited to 24 students who are admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. The full \$325 **commuter** registration fee includes all program costs. Registration forms, with payment information, can be completed online at www.wiu.edu/summeryouth, mailed to Study Abroad & Outreach, Horrabin Hall 8, Western Illinois University, 1 University Circle, Macomb, IL 61455, or faxed to (309) 298-2226. Checks are to be made payable to Western Illinois University.

Pricing and Payment Assistance : Register before March 15, 2018 & receive a 10% Early Bird Discount off the **\$325 commuter** registration cost. Registration includes all program costs. Payment Plan and Scholarship information is available by contacting our office. The full commuter fee is \$325. Parents who wish to use a Payment Plan may send a \$100 deposit at the time of registration. Full payment is due 30 days before the start of the program.

Refund Policy: WIU reserves the right to withdraw a program because of unforeseen circumstances or insufficient enrollment. If a program is withdrawn, participants will be notified and fees will be refunded. A \$50 fee will be charged to participants who cancel after Monday, May 11, 2018. **No refunds will be made on or after Monday, June 18, 2018.**

Location: The program is a commuter program on the WIU-Macomb campus. Classes are held both on and off campus and meet Monday through Friday.

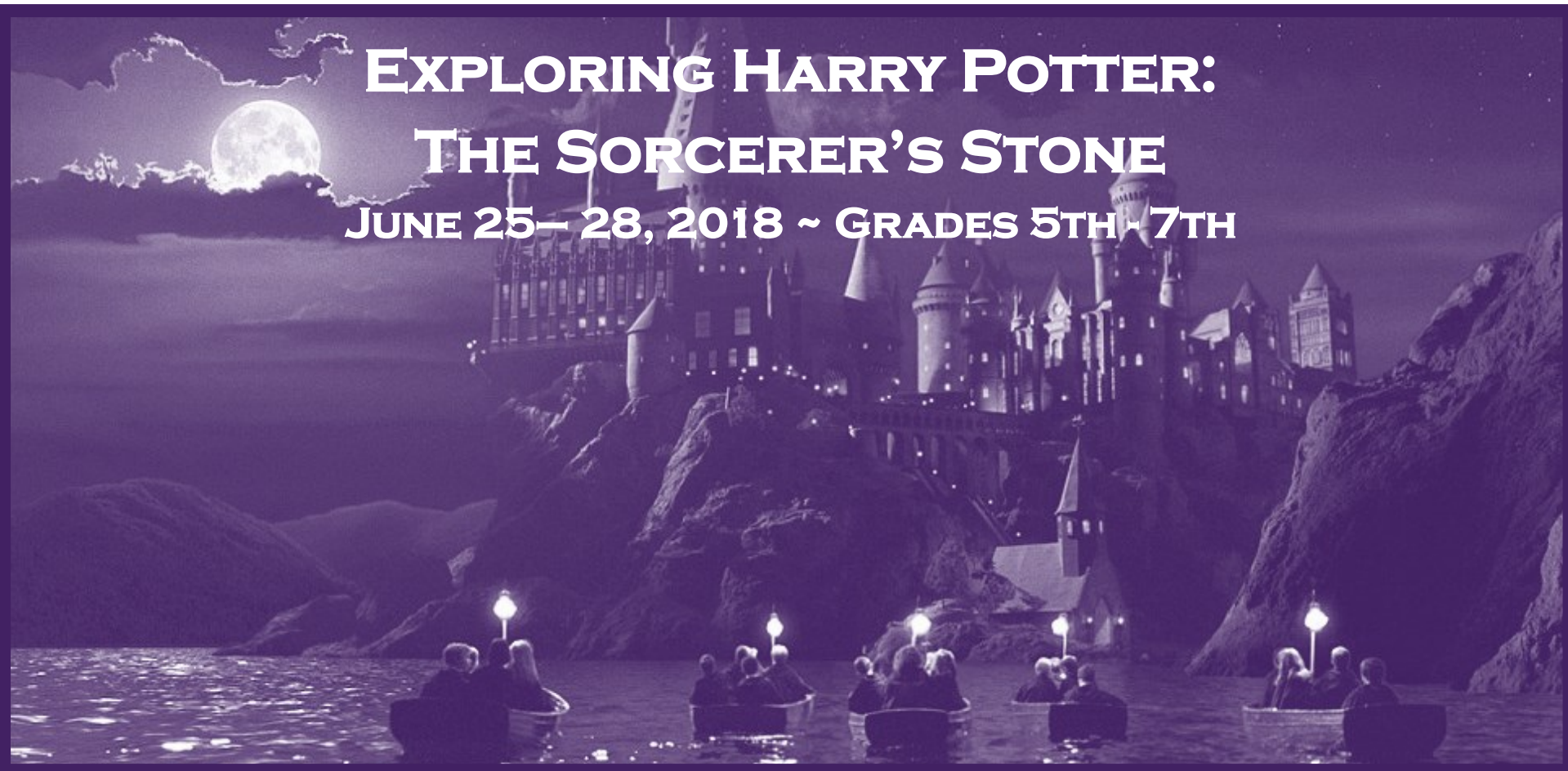

EXPLORING HARRY POTTER: THE SORCERER'S STONE

Program Description

Western Illinois University's summer Harry Potter program is specifically designed to stimulate and challenge students who read and enjoy the Harry Potter series. Under the guidance of members of Western Illinois University's English and Chemistry departments and local artists, students expand their enjoyment of the first book of the Harry Potter series while at the same time gaining valuable skills in literature, writing, science, and art.

Topics will include:

Literature: During this session, we will learn more about J.K. Rowling and what inspired her to write Harry Potter. We will delve into "Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone," examining how Harry came to Hogwarts and what brought him there. We will examine the language of wizardry, potions, and Hogwarts. We will determine our house and discuss the rules of Hogwarts and what it means to be a wizard. We will also explore the role of friendship and how the first book in this series lays a foundation for the next books.

Writing: In this session, you'll learn how to create characters as complex as Harry, Hermione, and Ron. We'll paint, with words, a setting as magical as Hogwart's, and set forth our characters into marvelous and magical adventures. You'll become acquainted with all of the tools J.K. Rowling has in her writing toolbox, and use them to tell stories that are uniquely your own. Unleash your imagination and let your creativity soar as we study and practice the art of storytelling!

Art: Join us this summer as we bring the world of Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone to life through exciting hands-on art projects that will help prepare you for your first year at Hogwarts! With clay you'll begin the week by creating your own pet owl truly worthy of Eeylops Owl Emporium. We'll then venture into papermaking to create a stack of

handmade parchment perfect for your studious notes and creative daydreaming. Lastly, we'll create a beautiful and fast flow quill even Hermione would envy! We have so much to discover and create...Accio Art!

Science: We will have the opportunity to learn to create some of the "magic" effects involved in the Harry Potter movies. We will learn to write and develop secret messages using acid and base chemistry. We will examine whether it is possible to fly using a broomstick as well as study the consequences of gravity. Finally, we will mix and create potions in the chemistry labs of Horrabin Hall!

Program is open to students in grades fifth through seventh who are admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. Enrollment is limited to 20 students, so please register early.
