GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTRATION: Enrollment is limited. Please register early; students are admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. This program is a commuter program and is limited to 24 students. The commuter fee includes instruction, supplies, and lunch. Please mail the registration form with a check or credit card information to Study Abroad & Outreach, Horrabin Hall 8, Western Illinois University, 1 University Circle, Macomb, IL 61455-1390, or fax your registration with credit card information to (309) 298-2854. PAYMENT: The full commuter fee is \$249. Parents who wish to use a Payment Plan may send a \$100 deposit at the time of registration up to 60 days before the program start date. Fifty percent of the registration fee is due at 60 days prior to the program, and full payment is due 30 days before the start of the program.

LOCATION: The program is a commuter program on the WIU-Macomb campus. Classes are held in Horrabin and Currens Halls and meet Monday through Thursday. Typical program days follow regular school hours.

MEDICAL/ADA COMPLIANCE: Students do not qualify for University health care, so parents should check family insurance policies for health and accident coverage.

Exploring Harry Potter: The Sorcerer's Stone

THE PROGRAM

Western Illinois University's summer **Exploring Harry Potter** program is specifically designed to stimulate and challenge students who read and enjoy the Harry Potter series. Under the guidance of members of WIU's English and Chemistry departments, students expand their enjoyment of the Harry Potter series while at the same time gaining valuable skills in literature, writing, science, and film studies.

PARTICIPATION CRITERIA

Participating students must be in the fifth, sixth, or seventh grades in January 2015. Gifted status or minimum qualifying scores on standardized tests are not requirements; however, this is not a remedial program. Participants should have sufficient curiosity, motivation, achievement level, and maturity to benefit from the program. The student must be recommended for the program by a teacher or school administrator as indicated on the registration form. We take these recommendations seriously and may call for further information regarding the student's background. A recommendation to the program does not guarantee acceptance; recommended students are admitted on a first-come, first-served basis.

SPECIAL FEATURES

How did you hear about the program?

Faculty from WIU's Departments of English and Chemistry teach the instructional portions of the program. All classroom and laboratory instruction are done in WIU's electronic classrooms in Horrabin Hall or in the Currens Hall laboratories. The program offers students an exciting introduction to the university environment. All faculty and their assistants share a particular interest in teaching young students and are dedicated to helping further each student's interest and enjoyment of Harry Potter.

TOPICS

Literature: During this session, we will learn more about J.K. Rowling and what inspired her to write the Harry Potter series. We will delve into Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone, examining what brought Harry to Hogwarts. We will examine the language of wizardry, potions, and Hogwarts. We will determine our house and discuss the rules of Hogwarts and what it means to be a wizard. We will also explore the role of friendship and how the first book in this series lays a foundation for the next books.

Writing: In this session, you'll learn how to create characters as complex as Harry, Hermione, and Ron. We'll paint, with words, a setting as magical as Hogwarts, and set forth our characters into marvelous and magical adventures. You'll become acquainted with all of the tools J.K. Rowling has in her writing toolbox and will use them to tell stories that are uniquely your own. Unleash your imagination and let your creativity soar as we study and practice the art of storytelling!

Science: We will have the opportunity to learn to create some of the "magic" effects involved in the Harry Potter movies. We will learn to write and develop secret messages using acid and base chemistry. We will examine whether it is possible to fly using a broomstick as well as study the consequences of gravity. Finally, we will mix and create potions in the chemistry labs of Currens Hall!

Film: Fantasy films in particular require convincing settings, composition, and subjects that allow us to be immersed in the created world. We will view clips from several Harry Potter movies to understand the use of the camera and special effects. We also will learn how music, dialogue, sound, and editing aid in creating the wonderful fantasy world of Harry Potter!
