Meditating on the Mississippi: An Environmental Exploration of the River

July 6-10, 2015

A College Preparatory Program in English, Math, and Science



General Information

REGISTRATION: Enrollment is limited to 24 students, so please register early. The registration fee is \$295 and includes instruction, laboratory supplies, and lunch. Parents who wish to use a **Payment Plan** may send a \$50 deposit at the time of registration, up to 60 days before the program start date. Fifty percent of the registration fee is due at 60 days prior to the program, and full payment is due 30 days before the start of the program.

LOCATION: This weeklong program, which will be based on the new Western Illinois University—Quad Cities campus, will be offered to local commuter students. Instructional portions take place at WIU-QC and at various community locations. Program instruction includes telescope viewings as well as field trips to Lock & Dam 15 and the Nahant Marsh, the largest urban watershed in the world. All students are supervised by WIU faculty

and program staff throughout the program day to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience.

MEDICAL/ADA COMPLIANCE: Students do not qualify for University health care, so parents should check family insurance policies for health and accident coverage. Western is in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Meditating on the Mississippi

The Program

College ready is a term used by many to describe the ability of students to tackle college-level, credit-bearing coursework. Although many students take college preparatory courses in high school, some find themselves struggling with English composition, college-level math, and science. Students who successfully transition to college possess key cognitive strategies, background on key content areas, key academic behaviors, and contextual skills and awareness. They have strong foundations in English, math, science, and social studies and are able to write, problem solve, measure, and accurately interpret information. They are organized, possess strong study skills, and can work within the parameters of a group.

Using the exploration of our local region, this program is designed for students who intend to enroll in a college or university after graduation. It is structured to assist students in gauging their college readiness as well as to address key resources and skills to aid in college-level success. **Meditating on the Mississippi** will challenge students to measure and interpret information, synthesize it, work together, and write about their findings and their experiences. University biologists, physicists, and professors will instruct in English, math, biology, and physics with the assistance of University support staff who will present on writing, tutoring, and college readiness.

Program content includes an introduction to the Upper Mississippi River to examine the world's third largest watershed. Participants will learn about using maps, photos, and Geographic Information Systems (GIS). They will analyze spatial information, edit data in maps, and interpret the results. During the program, participants will also examine the living organisms of the area—plants, animals, fish, turtles, and invertebrates—in a hands-on learning atmosphere. They will take field trips to Nahant Marsh (the largest urban watershed) and Lock & Dam 15 to examine population dynamics, probability, and water quality issues in the process. In addition, they will spend time with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to examine the structural components of the lock and dam system and learn how the dam affects the surrounding environment. Participants will also spend time in astronomical observation and use statistics, geometry, and trigonometry to map our area and the sky above us. And lastly, participants will take the information they have gathered within the program and translate it into coherent, logical, college-level writing.

Participation Criteria

Completion of at least one year of high school by summer 2015 is required of all participants. We recommend that students come to the program with one year of algebra and some geometry as well. Although gifted status or minimum qualifying scores on standardized tests are not requirements; this is not a remedial program. Participants should have sufficient curiosity, motivation, achievement level, and maturity to benefit from the program. Students must be recommended for the program by a teacher or school administrator as indicated on the registration form. A follow-up e-mail/phone call to the recommender may be used to verify the student's suitability for the program. A recommendation to the program does not guarantee acceptance. Enrollment is limited to 24 students, so please register early.

Special Features

Faculty from WIU's Institute for Environmental Studies and Departments of Biological Sciences, English, and Physics coordinate the instructional portion of the program and are available throughout the week for group and individual discussions. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Rock Island District Headquarters will provide a tour of Lock & Dam 15, hands-on activities on environmental restoration with Corps Park Rangers, and other activities.

Participants will experience WIU-QC's classrooms, laboratories, and nearby community resources as part of the program. The new WIU-QC campus uses a geothermal heating and cooling system, energy-efficient lighting and controls, recycled building materials and finishes, and a vegetative roof system as part of its commitment to sustainability.
