STARNET REGIONS

STARNET is divided into six regions in Illinois. **This is the events calendar of Northwest Region I and Central Region III.** To determine your STARNET region, see the map of Illinois counties inside. If you belong to another region, please contact your region to inquire about training opportunities in your area.

COMMUNITY COLLABORATION

WORKSHOPS that promote best practices in early childhood are planned in collaboration with local agencies and school districts. If you would like to plan a training event with us, please call (800) 227-7537 ext. 250.

COMMUNITY FORUMS represent all those involved with young children in a particular area. Early childhood education and care is nurtured through community forums, and STARNET has a history of supporting area partnerships. Resource Specialists can assist local efforts to organize your early childhood neighborhood.

The EARLY CHILDHOOD COMMUNITY FOCUS GROUP acts as an advisory forum for the planning and coordination of training initiatives among programs/agencies and assists the STARNET staff in the input, feedback, and review of Regions I & III grant activities.

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE & ON-SITE CONSULTATION

STARNET staff are available to provide assistance and support of early childhood related

issues and program concerns. Call us to share ideas, investigate resources, and brainstorm solutions. We also welcome the opportunity to visit classrooms and network with early childhood professionals and families.

RESOURCE LIBRARY

FAMILY FOCUS

STARNET offers Family Fellowships, conferences, and workshops promoting family-centered perspectives. Family Resource Specialists, who are parents of children with special needs, provide information, support, & training to families and providers.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

FELLOWSHIPS: STARNET provides fellowship reimbursement funds to individuals so they may attend Illinois trainings. Family members of a child with special needs who is enrolled in or will transition to early childhood special education services and professionals who provide early childhood special education services are eligible to apply. Funds may be used for workshop registration, travel, substitute teachers, and child care (families only).

Workshop Information

WORKSHOP FEES

All workshops offered through STARNET are **free of charge** unless otherwise noted.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

Registrations are taken by mail, fax, or website, but not by phone. Submit one registration per person (i.e., do not list multiple names on one form). A registration form is included in this events calendar and may be mailed to: STARNET Regions I & III, Western Illinois University, Horrabin Hall 32, Macomb, IL 61455, or faxed to: (309) 298-2305. **You may also register online at www.starnet.org.**

Please do not assume automatic acceptance. Because STARNET is an early childhood grant project, if a waiting list develops, priority is given to family members of and professionals working with children age 3-5. Priority is also given to persons in Regions I & III (unless the workshop is a collaboration with another region). Otherwise, participants are registered on a first-come, first-served basis. **The final list will be determined and confirmation letters (and waiting list notices if applicable) will be sent three weeks prior to the workshop.** If you do not receive either a confirmation letter or a waiting list notice, please call (800) 227-7537.

STARTING TIMES & LUNCH

Registration begins 30 minutes before start time. Registered participants should carefully check the start time for the workshop, and be signed in before that time. There will generally be a one hour break for lunch. Lunch will be on your own, unless noted.

CANCELLATION

Call STARNET at 800-227-7537 ext. 247 if you need to cancel, so that we may notify those on the waiting list of the opportunity to attend. Because of the popularity of these sessions, registrants who neglect to cancel will be given a lower priority for registration at future workshops. STARNET reserves the right to cancel any workshop due to low registration.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

STARNET is a Professional Development Provider of Continuing Professional Development Units (CPDUs) and Child Development Associate (CDA) credit. STARNET is also authorized by the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation as a Continuing Education Sponsor to provide CE hours for Licensed Speech-Language Pathologists/Audiologists, Registered Social Workers, Licensed Clinical Professional Counselors, Physical Therapists, and Occupational Therapists (5 contact hours=5 CE hours). Early Intervention Credit may be available for selected workshops through Illinois Early Intervention Training. Check their website, www.illinoiseitraining.org or call 708-444-8460 to verify or request EI approval.

If contact hours are listed, they are applicable for CPDU, CDA, and CE Credit. Workshop participants will be given a certificate (ISBE Evidence of Completion) showing the number of contact hours. **Attendance for the entire session is necessary in order to receive a certificate.** Contact hours will not be adjusted to meet individual needs. To avoid distractions and enable everyone to fully participate, children are not permitted in workshops.

ILLINOIS TEACHING & LEARNING STANDARDS

Trainings offered by STARNET are applicable to the Illinois Professional Teaching Standard on Instructional Delivery, "The teacher understands how individuals grow, develop, and learn and provides learning opportunities that support the intellectual, social, and personal development of all students." Unless otherwise indicated, trainings are applicable to all of the Illinois Early Learning Standards.

ACCESSIBILITY

All workshops will be held at sites that are accessible. Please make your request no later than two weeks before the scheduled event for special accommodations, such as sign language, translated or large print materials, special diet, etc.

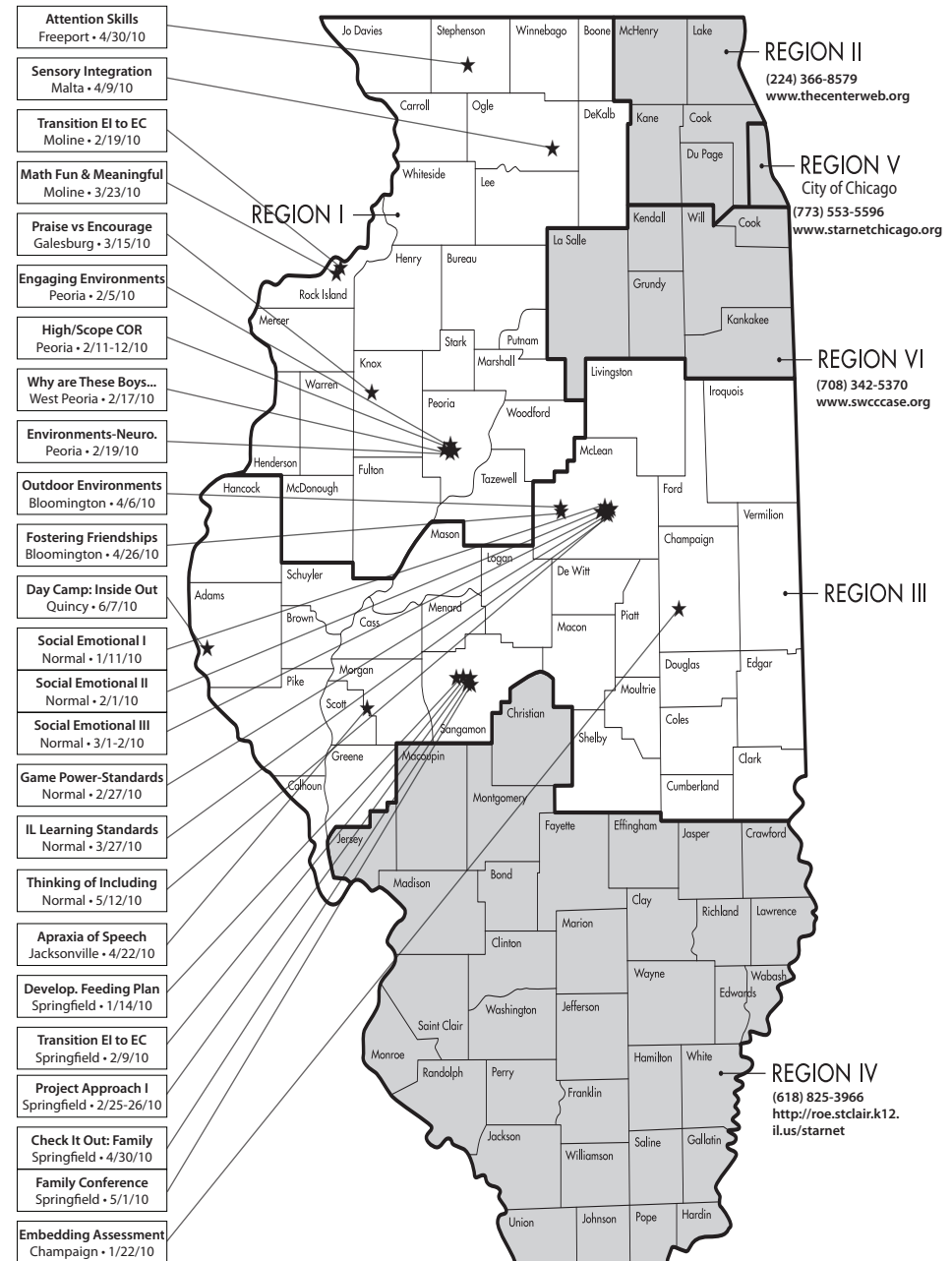


Apples Video Magazine Information
