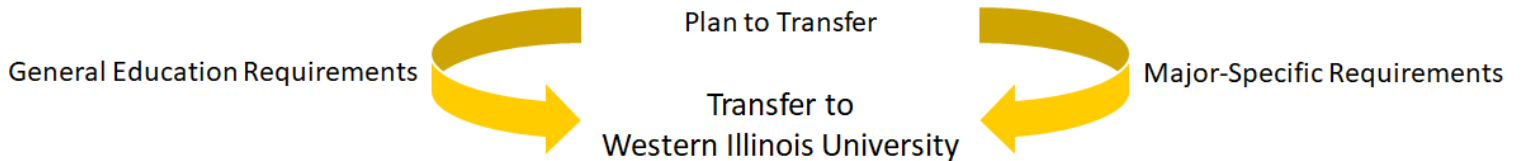

This transfer guide will help you plan courses at Joliet Junior College that will meet general education and major-specific requirements at Western Illinois University. Work closely with your Joliet Junior College advisor and your WIU Admissions Counselor when planning and selecting your coursework. Preparing well will ensure that you save time and money by taking courses that are required for your major.




Plan Your Community College Classes

5 WAYS TO COMPLETE YOUR GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

General education courses are a required part of your bachelor's degree. There are five ways to complete the WIU general education requirements. Please note that some majors require specific general education courses. Refer to the Major-Specific Requirements noted in this guide.

1. Complete the **Associate of Arts (AA)** degree.
2. Complete the **Associate of Science (AS)** degree, and take two additional general education courses at WIU (one course in Humanities or Fine Arts and one course in Social and Behavioral Sciences).
3. Complete the **Illinois Articulation Initiative General Education Core Curriculum (IAI GECC)**. IAI GECC completion must be noted on your academic transcript. To determine IAI GECC at Joliet Junior College, use the course planning worksheet available at itransfer.org/courses/worksheet.php
4. Complete a minimum of **30 credits at Joliet Junior College**, and complete the **IAI GECC at WIU**.
5. Complete **Western Illinois University's General Education** requirements:
 - 9 hours of English Composition & Public Speaking
 - 10 hours of Mathematics & Natural Science
 - 9 hours of Social Sciences
 - 9 hours of Humanities/Fine Arts
 - 3 hours of Multicultural Studies
 - 3 hours of Human Well-Being

Degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences may have additional coursework to satisfy college curriculum requirements.
