Start Your Transfer Experience

This transfer guide will help you plan courses at Eastern Iowa Community Colleges (EICC) that will meet general education and major-specific requirements at Western Illinois University. Work closely with your EICC advisor and your WIU Admissions Counselor when planning and selecting your coursework. Preparing well will ensure that you save time and money by taking courses that are required for your major.



Plan Your Community College Classes

Follow the steps below to plan your community college courses to match general education requirements at Western Illinois University. General education courses are a required part of your bachelor's degree.

Western Illinois University General Education Requirements

- 9 hours of English Composition & Public Speaking
- 10 hours of Mathematics & Natural Science
- 9 hours of Social Sciences
- 9 hours of Humanities/Fine Arts
- 3 hours of Multicultural Studies
- 3 hours of Human Well-Being

1. Locate each category of WIU general education requirements (listed above) in the degree requirements section of the community college catalog: (This link takes <http://www.eicc.edu/future-students/transfer-programs/>)
2. Select from courses in each category of the community college catalog:
 - a. Match your courses to the required credit hours for each corresponding WIU general education category.
 - b. Note your community college's requirements for each general education category.
3. Check the courses you have selected by contacting your community college academic advisor and/or your WIU Admissions Counselor.

Which Associate Degree Should I Choose?

AA

Associate of Art – Completion of this degree will satisfy WIU General Education requirements. This degree is designed to transfer and parallel the first two years of a bachelor's degree.

AS

Associate of Science – Completion of this degree will satisfy some WIU General Education requirements but does not guarantee all requirements will be met. This degree is designed to transfer into math & science-related majors.

AAS

Associate of Applied Science – Completion of this degree will not meet WIU General Education requirements. This degree is designed for direct employment, and is not designed to transfer.

Education majors are required to pass the Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP), or in lieu of the TAP, submit ACT+Writing or SAT scores. Students completing the ACT+Writing after 9/10/2016 need to earn a 22 composite score and a 6 on the English/Writing section. Students completing the SAT after 3/5/2016 need to earn a 1110 composite score (Evidence-based Reading & Writing, Math) and a 26 on the Writing & Language section.</i></p>
