Categories of Competition

- Rocky Category - Fraternity and Sorority Life
 - Each Greek team may consist of up to four (4) campus-affiliated Greek letter organizations (can be social, business, multicultural, etc.) All organization names must appear on one Homecoming Team Entry Form.
- Ray Category - General Student Organizations/Residence Hall
 - Each team must be made up of a minimum of 5 WIU students. Teams must be composed of no more than four (4) OSE-recognized student organizations. Only one team from each residence hall. (ex. Corbin-Olson can have only one team, Linc-Wash Grote can have only one team, and Thompson can have only one team.)
- Gold Category - Extended Editions General Student / Individual
 - Each team must be made up of a minimum of 3 WIU students. Gold Category criteria will be specified in each individual event section. Please read the event rules carefully to see the criteria needed for this category to participate!



General Homecoming Rules

- All entry forms must be submitted online, via Leatherneck Link, and all entry fees to the Office of Student Engagement by Friday, October 7th at 4:30 PM.
- All student organizations participating must be registered with the Office of Student Engagement via Leatherneck Link. Any student organization that is not registered will be permitted to participate on a case-by-case basis. Please contact the Office of Student Engagement if interested.
- Each organization on a team must have ONLY ONE individual to represent that organization. For example, if three Greek organizations form a team, we need a representative from each organization. These individuals are the only ones who can submit appeals.
- It is mandatory for teams to send a maximum of 2 representatives to attend at least one General Rules Meeting. General Rules Meeting I will be held on April 13th, 2022 at 5-6:30 pm in the Lincoln room. General Rules Meeting II will be held on September 7th, 2022 at 5-6:30 pm in the Capitol Room.
- It is mandatory that all representatives fill out the Google Form to sign-in at the beginning of the meeting. Failure to do so will result in ineligibility to participate in Homecoming 2022. All Google Form responses must be submitted BEFORE the meeting begins!
- All participants must fill out the google form provided after each meeting to confirm that they have read and understood all the rules and regulations. Failure to complete the google form will result in the individual being disqualified and cannot participate in any/all homecoming events.
- Any violation of the rules or regulations will result in the loss of points to the sponsoring team and possible disqualification from the event and/or remaining Homecoming events. Each event has specific rules for participation. Please read each event page carefully.
- Points will be awarded to the team, not to each organization that comprises a team, if there is more than one organization on a team.



General Homecoming Rules

- In the event of a tie both teams will receive the same amount of points and the next place team will be dropped to the following place. Please see the scoring breakdowns.
- Good sportsmanship is required. Inappropriate or derogatory comments or actions made about other teams, the Homecoming committee members and/or judges may result in the **DISQUALIFICATION** of the team from the competition.
- There will be a \$10.00 entry fee per team to participate in any of the following events: Paint the Town, Rocky's Bubble Soccer, Variety Show, Chalk the Campus, Rocky Hunt, Yell Like Hell, and Parade. Fees are non-refundable and will be used for administrative costs associated with the event. Each organization on each team will be responsible for their event entry fees. For example, if your team participates in Paint the Town and Variety Show, each organization would pay a total of \$20.00.
- Alcohol and all other drugs are strictly prohibited from all Homecoming events. Evidence, including, but not limited to: appearing inebriated, smelling of alcohol or drugs, empty alcohol bottles in assigned sections during cleanup, etc. will result in point deductions and may result in disqualification from the event and all remaining Homecoming events.
- The Homecoming Committee reserves the right to add, omit, and revise any and all rules governing the Homecoming Week competition, without advance notice. Updated rule books will be released through the UUB Homecoming website.
- The Homecoming Committee reserves the right to penalize or disqualify teams for having negative and/or rude behavior towards other teams, judges, and/or Committee members with a reasonable explanation. The Homecoming Committee also reserves the right to penalize or disqualify teams without advanced notice in event a situation as such occurs.
- Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, we require all Homecoming participants, committee members, and spectators to abide by the COVID-19 protocols put into place by the University during the time of any and all Homecoming related activities. If Homecoming participants do not abide by COVID-19 protocols during any and all homecoming related activities, including, but not limited to: Variety Show checks, Yell Like Hell checks, etc. the Homecoming Committee members and/or judges may result in the DISQUALIFICATION of the team from the competition.
- All participants must be in compliance with the University's COVID-19 protocols, i.e. weekly testing or full vaccination status. If the participant(s) are not in compliance with the University's COVID-19 protocols they will NOT be permitted to participate in any and all homecoming related activities.



Royalty

Each year, the Homecoming Committee will determine the number of students to serve on Royalty Court. Candidates are nominated by the organizations and groups that compete in Homecoming or individuals can self nominate. Each organization can submit a nomination for one student, regardless of that student's gender identity. All Royalty Court applications are due online via Leatherneck Link, by Friday, October 7th 2021.

How to Become a Candidate: A Step-By-Step Guide

- Get nominated by your sponsoring registered student organization or friends, for Royalty Court.
- Submit your application for Royalty by Friday, October 7th at 4:30 PM.
- Applications will be evaluated by a panel of judges, and a pool of semi-finalists will be selected to move forward, based on the highest scores. Finalists will be offered an interview.
- Judge scores from the application questions and interview portions will be added together, and a Royalty Court of a maximum of 12 students will be selected.
- Voting will be held on Leatherneck Link starting Friday, September 24th and will end Wednesday, September 29th to determine the two winners – the Homecoming Royalty.



Royalty

General Requirements for the Royalty Court Candidates:

1. Candidates must have a minimum 2.500 cumulative grade point average.
2. Candidates must be full-time undergraduate students at WIU with a minimum of 60 credit hours completed.
3. Candidates must be in good judicial standing, as deemed by the University.
4. All finalists must attend the mandatory Royalty Meeting, to be announced later. At this meeting, candidates will be given the requirements and expectations for royalty.

Rock the Flags

- The flag must be painted incorporating the Homecoming theme, Western Illinois University spirit, and the student organization(s). Each flag is to be painted in good taste and must relate to the theme.
- Each flag must be a flat twin bed sheet of any color.
- Teams must supply their own materials, and the flag CANNOT CONTAIN ANY GLITTER.
- Each team's flag must be fully dried when turned in. If the flag is not dried, it will receive 0 points, but may still be displayed.
- Each flag will be displayed at the University Union Concourse by the Homecoming Committee. Flags can be picked up from the Office of Student Engagement after Homecoming Week.

Rocky Hunt

There will be 20 - 25 total Rocky statues hidden outside and inside buildings all around campus on Monday, October 17th, Wednesday, October 19th, and Friday, October 21st. The Rocky Category (Fraternity and Sorority Life) will search for dogs on October 17th, the Ray Category (General Organizations and Residence Halls) will search for the dogs on October 19th, and the Gold Category (General Student and Individual) will be on October 21st.

Details:

1. Teams must arrive at (TBD but 9:00 am is the plan) on the day their category is scheduled to hunt.
2. Phones, smartwatches, etc. are prohibited and must be left in the Office of Student Engagement as soon as participants arrive.
3. Teams are expected to arrive 15 - 20 minutes early so that the Homecoming Committee can hide the statues.
4. The statues will be spread around campus inside and outside of buildings. Please be respectful and mindful when searching for a Rocky statue in the buildings. Any disruptive behavior reported back to the Homecoming Committee will result in **DISQUALIFICATION**.
5. Each day a list of clues will be given to the participants once all the statues have been hidden.
6. Each statue card must be brought back to the Office of Student Engagement. Once all the statute cards have been returned, the hunt is over.
7. Each statue will be worth a different amount of points. Each point value will be announced on the statue card or the clue list.



Paint the Town

1. Only tempera paints can be used for the window designs! No glitter may be used, but glitter tempera paint is permitted. Failure to comply will result in immediate DISQUALIFICATION.
2. One representative from each team must report to Citizens National Bank entrance on Saturday, October 15th at 10:00 am where all of your paint WILL BE INSPECTED before you are allowed to begin painting. All decisions about paint made by the committee are final. Failure to check-in before painting will result in DISQUALIFICATION.
3. Window panes must be painted between 10:00 AM and 12:00 PM. Late entries will NOT be accepted.
4. The window pane must be painted in good taste and must incorporate Western Illinois University, the Homecoming theme, and the student organization name or image in the design. If the design is inappropriate or violates any above rules, the Homecoming Committee reserves the right to remove the painting.
5. Teams must supply their own materials including, but not limited to: paint, stencils, brushes, and a drop cloth. A drop cloth should be provided by the team and must be used when painting the window pane. Please do not drip paint on the sidewalks or grass.
6. If teams are unable to provide their own materials, teams can request a small starter kit for their organization by emailing uubhomecoming@wiu.edu. This is a starter kit only and will not be enough for a full entire window.
7. Each team will be responsible for having their window cleaned properly by 5:00 PM on Sunday, October 23rd. If the window is not cleaned properly by this deadline, the team responsible for cleaning the window will be charged a \$250 fine, and DISQUALIFIED from this year's event.
8. We cannot guarantee access to the inside of all of the buildings, so please plan accordingly. If your team wants to use the inside of a building, you are responsible for contacting the business. If they refuse, you must stay with the same business and change your plan.

Chalk the Campus

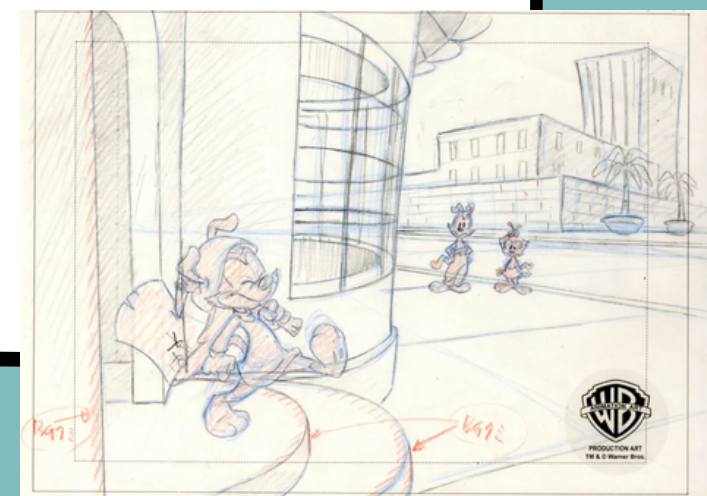
Details:

1. One representative from each team must report to the University Union Terrace on Sunday, October 16th at 4:00 PM to check in.
2. The Special Events Chair will assign each team a section of the sidewalk for each organization to chalk. Chalking must be done on Sunday, October 16th between 4:00 PM and 6:00 PM. Late entries will NOT be accepted.
3. Teams must supply their own materials. Chalk, sketches, and stencils are the only materials that can be used.
4. Spots will be marked off and designated for each group. Each group will be given the same approximate-sized space to chalk in.
5. Each chalk mural must incorporate Western Illinois University, the Homecoming theme, and the student organizations that are chalking the mural. For individuals that are participating, you need to all incorporate your names instead of your student organizations title.

Bubble Soccer

- A match is played by two teams, each consisting of no more than 6 players. A match cannot begin if either team consists of fewer than 6 players unless approved by the Homecoming Committee.
- There must be an even number of gender identities on the field at all times. Example: 2 male identifying players, 2 female identifying females, and 2 transgender or non-binary players. Or, 3 female identifying players, and 3 male identifying players.
- Goalkeepers are not allowed to be an active player on the field.
- There will be a crease and / or line in front of the goal; players can travel through the crease and / or line but cannot stay in the area for more than 3 seconds.
- Substitutions will be allowed during the match at any time during active play. To substitute a player, the player coming off the field needs to stand by the sideline of the field, as the new player going onto the field crosses the side-line to enter the game simultaneously.
- All substitutions will be checked for equipment by a referee before entering the field.
- The referees provided for the match are the supervision of the matches, but will also ensure safety of the players.
- Excessive force bumps without the intent to gain possession of the ball or without the intent to clear the path of the ball to goal, will result in a 2 minute penalty based on the discretion of the referee.
- The referee has the authority to eject a player from the game if any bumps are from blind spots, or when the safety of the opponent is endangered. Potential disqualification can occur through the discretion of the Homecoming Committee.
- Bumping opponents outside the boundary cones is NOT legal. Point of contact / bump determines what is a bump in the out of boundary areas. A bump inside the playing field that results in an opponent falling outside that playing area IS legal.
- Each player must be in their bubble suit before stepping onto the field. The suit should be worn in its proper manner, and will be checked by the referee before the match begins.
- Bubble suits will be provided by the Homecoming Committee and Campus Recreation.
- Players must wear tennis shoes or turf shoes. Soccer cleats are prohibited and can result in **DISQUALIFICATION** if worn.



Bubble Soccer

- No jewelry or sharp objects may be worn during matches and while in the bubble suit. Glasses may be used, however will be worn with an eyewear retainer to keep them on the player at all times.
- Players who are knocked to the ground during play must be allowed to get up before being contacted again by the opposing team.
- Referees will start the whistle 3 times consecutively to either stop, start or to signal the end of a half / or game. All players **MUST STOP** if they hear the signal.
- Active game play can be stopped at any time during the match by the referee to respond to any safety concerns if necessary.
- If a match is stopped by the referee, it will be resumed by 1 whistle blow to resume the match.
- Length of game times and single or double elimination brackets will be determined once the number of overall teams have been finalized.
- At the beginning of the match, both teams will line up on the "baseline" closest to their respective goals. The referee will place the ball in the middle of the field and blow the whistle 1 time to begin the match. This start will occur during the following; at the beginning of the game, the second half, and after each goal is scored.
- Referees are to stop the match if the ball goes out of bounds, and should wait for ball handlers to return with the ball.
- Referees will call and state "PLAY ON" to indicate to a player that the ball is still active if it's out of bounds.
- Referees will have 2 balls on hand, 1 ball will be actively in play during the match.
- Teams must designate three ball chasers for their teams.
- If the ball is kicked an excessive length out of bounds, the referee will then roll the second ball into play for the other team to start with.
- If a ball is reintroduced into the field, the referee will call "PLAY ON" to indicate a new ball was introduced into the match.
- A goal is scored when the whole of the ball passes over the goal line, between the goalposts and under the crossbar, provided no infringement of the Laws of the Game have been committed previously by the team scoring the goal.
- The team who scores the most goals during a match is the winner of that match.
- If both teams score an equal number of goals, or if no goals are scored in the allotted time, an extra allotted time will be played to determine a winner. Then, three penalty kicks will be given to each team.
- Rocky's Bubble Soccer does not utilize or use any off-side rules.
- Violation of any rules stated above will result in automatic **DISQUALIFICATION**.

Variety Show

- Any music needed for your routine must be shared with the Homecoming Committee as a .mp3 file. Music must be turned in via uubhomecoming@wiu.edu no later than Wednesday, October 12th. No phone, auxiliary cables, or jump drive music will be accepted as methods to play music. Your submission must be named "TeamName.Event.mp3" (ex. HomecomingCommittee.V-Show.mp3).
- Each group using audio is required to have one member not participating in the performance to assist WESTEC in cueing the audio. Additional information for this member will be distributed at the mandatory meeting.
- Props are allowed, but a detailed list must be brought to routine checks on Wednesday, October 12th. Prop list must be approved by the Variety Show chair(s) before the team's routine check is over. Any prop changes after routine checks must be approved by the Homecoming Committee.
- Each team is allowed one act. This act should consist of no fewer than 5 and no more than 30 participants. Each act will be judged under the same criteria regardless of the number of participants. We encourage everyone to incorporate both individual and group activities into the organization's single act.
- Set up time is not included in performance time. Each team will have one minute after their performance to clean up (people, props, and any mess made). Over by less than 30 seconds = 10 points, more than 30 seconds = 20 points.
- Each act can be up to five minutes long, and the time limit for each routine will be determined by the number of teams registered. Any performances longer than 5 minutes will result in a deduction of points. Over by less than 30 seconds = 10 points, more than 30 seconds = 20 points.
- Each must have at least one talent that is unique. The talent will be approved the day of the routine check. Any talent changes after routine checks must be approved by the Homecoming Committee. Please note talent points will be up to the judge's discretion. If the talent is changed and not notified to the chairs then they will receive no points.
- Acts must contain no front or back flips, front or back handsprings, aerials or any acrobatics.
- Acts that contain degrading or offensive material will result in an immediate DISQUALIFICATION from the event.



Variety Show

- Each team must provide the Homecoming Committee with a typed list of participants at the Variety Show routine check. A final list of participants and alternates must be sent to the Variety Show chair(s) before the event, and a hard copy brought to the rehearsal times. Everyone in the act must be a current WIU student and a member of the performing team's organization.
- Absolutely NO glitter, confetti, confetti cannon(s), or anything that will create a large mess to clean up is allowed. If you are unsure about the size of your mess, please consult the Homecoming Committee.
- Each participant must check-in with their valid WIU student ID and be seated in their designated location. Be prompt. Each participant will be given a wristband when checking-in; the wristband will be removed as participants are coming up on stage. Check-in begins at scheduled rehearsal time, up until 5:30 PM. Participants must be seated by 5:45 PM. The event begins promptly at 6:00 PM.
- Audience and participant behavior is an integral aspect of this competition. Booing and / or any other derogatory or abrasive comments are strongly prohibited. Every act should be shown the same courtesy that you want shown to your team during your performance. Any inappropriate behavior observed from a group will result in a verbal warning. If the behavior continues, there may be a point deduction from the total points your group receives and / or DISQUALIFICATION from the event.

Judging:

- Entries will be judged on the following:
- Creativity: Incorporation of talents, usage of props, costuming, etc.
- Incorporation of the Homecoming theme
- Spirit: Attitude, enthusiasm, crowd reaction
- Mechanics: Composition, togetherness, and how precise and synchronized the routine is in performance



Yell Like Hell

- Routines must be cheer-based and include more than one cheer. Cheers must reflect WIU spirit, and focus on supporting the University.
- All routines must be in good taste and can be no longer than 4 minutes in length. Any performances longer than 4 minutes will result in a deduction of points. Over by less than 30 seconds = 10 points, more than 30 seconds = 20 points. One minute will be given before and after routine to set up or clean up props.
- Minimum team size is 5 participants and maximum team size is 40 participants.
- Any music needed for your routine and roster for the team must be shared with the Homecoming Committee as an .mp3 file. Music can be turned in via uubhomecoming@wiu.edu no later than Friday, October 14th. No phone, auxiliary cable, or jump drive music will be accepted as methods to play music. Your submission must be named "TeamName.Event.mp3" (ex. HomecomingCommittee.YLH.mp3).
- Each group using audio is required to have one member not participating in the performance to assist WESTEC in cueing the audio. Additional information for this member will be distributed at the mandatory meeting.
- Tosses (i.e. basket tosses and free-falling moves) are not allowed. Any toss or free fall that is performed will result in **DISQUALIFICATION**.
- Any participant that is lifted off the ground must have two people spotting them for the duration of the lift. In the case of shoulder sits, one spotter is required. Failure to have a sufficient amount of spotters will also result in **DISQUALIFICATION**.



Yell Like Hell

- Absolutely NO glitter, confetti, confetti cannon(s), or anything that will create a large mess to clean up is allowed. If you are unsure about the size of your mess, please consult the Homecoming Committee. If participants wear or bring items with glitter on the mats, 25 points will automatically be deducted from their performance. All participants need to wear athletic shoes. Shoes will be checked before the performance. Clothes must be appropriate and match the theme.
- Each team must provide the Homecoming Committee with a typed list of tentative participants at the Yell Like Hell Safety Checks on Wednesday, October 19th. A final list of participants and alternates must be sent to the Yell Like Hell chair(s) before the event, and a hard copy brought to the rehearsal times. Everyone in the act must be a current WIU student and a member of the performing team's organization.
- Each participant must check-in with a valid WIU student ID, and be seated in their designated location. Participant check-in begins at 7:30 PM. A time for tumbling warm-ups will be given upon request. All participants and spectators must be seated by 7:45 PM. This event will begin promptly at 8:00 PM.
- Acts that contain degrading or offensive material will result in an immediate DISQUALIFICATION from the event.



Parade

- Float chairpersons must adhere to specific safety regulations when building their float. Float safety guidelines are located on the next page. Failure to adhere to these details may result in **DISQUALIFICATION**.
- The Homecoming Committee will be inspecting the floats the morning of the parade to ensure that the safety requirements are met.
- Teams have until **8:00 AM**, the morning of the parade, to submit a photo of the float that will be used by judging in case of destruction or severe weather. For points to be counted teams are still required to walk in the parade.
- In case of bad weather, your contact person will be called between **4:00 - 8:00 AM** on Sunday, October 2nd, announcing any changes to the start time. Please make sure your parade contact person provides the proper contact information.
- Floats must be in their starting line-up locations by the start of the parade (**10:30 AM**) or they will be **DISQUALIFIED**.
- Inappropriate behavior, comments and / or attire during the parade may result in **DISQUALIFICATION**. The Homecoming Committee reserves the right to make this call at any time.
- While items such as candy, beads, small toys, flyers, etc. may be handed out during the parade, no items may be thrown from any float. Entrants may have members of their organizations walk beside their float and handout giveaway items. Throwing items may result in **DISQUALIFICATION**.
- All drivers of motor vehicles in the parade must have a valid driver's license, and proof of insurance that can be validated by the Homecoming Committee.
- If you are caught driving under the influence, you will be subject to punishment by the University, and Macomb Police Department.

Detention

- All entry forms must be submitted online via Leatherneck Link, and all entry fees to the Office of Student Engagement by Friday, October 7th at 4:30 PM.
- Rules will be discussed at the General Rules Meeting I on Wednesday, April 13th from 5 - 6:30 PM and the General Rules Meeting II on Wednesday, September 7th from 5 - 6:30 PM.
- There will be a designated area you can send an individual to, for any (appropriate) reason, where that reason will be read out loud. If this is not appropriate, by our discretion, we may choose not to read it and possibly not send the individual to detention. However, the donation will be kept
- No points will be awarded.
- Will be offered at Yell Like Hell and V-Show during breaks / intermissions.
