Criteria for Cooperating Teacher Selection

Clinical Experience

- The cooperating teacher must have at least 3 years of successful teaching experience in the public school system.
- The cooperating teacher must be employed by a public or private school district approved by ISBE.
- The cooperating teacher must be recommended by the building principal.
- Past positive experience with pre-student teaching/student teaching students is preferred of the cooperating teacher.
- A master's degree is preferred, but not required of the cooperating teacher.
- Received a proficient or above performance rating in his or her most recent evaluation.
