Discussion and Actions Taken:

- A vote was held to determine whether to change the council's name. The committee voted to keep the current name, *Council for International Education*.
- While discussing the council's charge, "To determine appropriate standards for multicultural perspectives graduation requirements and update approval processes,"

 Dave Hunter recommended seeking guidance from Carl Ervin, Director of the Office of Justice, Inclusion, Diversity, and Equity, regarding a recently published list, Banned and Trigger Words in Federal Grant Writing, at https://grantwritingandfunding.com/banned-and-trigger-words-in-federal-grant-writing-in-the-trump-administration-2-0/. The list includes multicultural as a flagged term. Given this designation, the committee discussed whether the term multicultural should be revised when determining the appropriate standards for multicultural perspectives graduation requirements to ensure alignment with federal guidelines.
- An email has been sent to Carl Ervin, with Dr. Jeremy Robinett copied, but no response has been received yet.
- Brian Locke suggested inviting Kim McDaniel, Study Abroad Advisor, to a future meeting.
 - o She has agreed to attend the next meeting on Wednesday, March 26, 2015.
 - She also shared that only two faculty-led study abroad programs are scheduled for this year:
 - Politics in Argentina (May)
 - WISE Spain (June)
