Competitive Funding Opportunity: Low- or No-Emission Program (Opp. No. FTA-2024-003-TPM-LWNO)

Local Law Enforcement Grants for Enforcement of Cybercrimes Program (Opp. No. O-OVW-2024-171924)

Purpose: To enable states to support critical access hospitals (CAHs) in quality improvement, quality reporting, performance improvement and benchmarking; assist facilities seeking designation as CAHs; and establish or expand programs for the provision of rural emergency medical services.

Eligibility: State governments.

Funding: \$30 million; specific award amounts unlisted.

Purpose: To support the funding of research and program evaluation projects specific to the intervention and prevention of intentional, interpersonal firearm violence and mass shootings.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; public or Native American housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: \$5 million; awards up to \$3 million.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; state, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; public or Indian housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: 4 awards expected, up to \$2.5 million.

Rural Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking Program (Opp. No. O-OVW-2024-171933)

Purpose: To support efforts to enhance the safety of rural victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking; and support projects uniquely designed to address and prevent these crimes in rural areas.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; public, state, or private institutions of higher education; state, county, city, or township governments; and nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education).

Funding: \$36.4 million; awards between \$500,000 and \$950,000.

Transitional Housing Assistance Grants for Victims of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault and Stalking Program (Opp. No. O-OVW-2024-171925)

Funding: \$40 million; awards between \$400,000 and \$500,000.

**Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production (UAIP) Competitive Grants Program (Opp. No. USDA-NRCS-NHQ-UAIP-24-NOFO0001336)

Purpose: To support the efforts of farmers, gardeners, citizens, government officials, schools, members of tribal communities, and other stakeholders in areas where access to fresh foods is limited or unavailable.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments and organizations; state, county, city, township or special district governments; nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); public housing authorities; and independent school districts.

Funding: \$6.1 billion; awards between \$75 million and \$350 million.
