Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use, Site-Based Program (Opp. No. O-BJA-2025-172334)

CFDA No.: 16.838

Purpose: To support state, territorial, local, and tribal governments to reduce overdose deaths and the impact of illicit substance use and misuse on individuals and communities.

Eligibility: Native American tribal governments; and state, county, city, township, or special district governments.

Funding: Total unlisted; awards up to \$7 million.

Distance Learning and Telemedicine Grants (Opp. No. RUS-25-01-DLT)

CFDA No.: 10.855

Purpose: To provide financial assistance to enable and improve distance learning and telemedicine services in rural areas.

Eligibility: Nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); federally recognized Native American tribal governments; public, private, and state-controlled institutions of higher education; independent school districts; small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and state, county, city, township, or special district governments.

Funding: \$40 million; awards between \$50,000 and \$1 million.

Nursing Home Staffing Campaign (Opp. No. CMS-2V2-25-001)

Purpose: To administer financial incentives, such as tuition reimbursement and stipends, to Registered Nurses to work for three years in a qualifying nursing home or in an oversight role with a state agency.

Eligibility: Nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); public, private, and state-controlled institutions of higher education; small businesses; and for-profit organizations other than small businesses.

Funding: Total unlisted; awards between \$5 million and \$20 million.

Eligibility: Nonprofits with or without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS (other than institutions of higher education); Native American tribal governments; public, private, and state-controlled institutions of higher education; independent school districts; small businesses; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and state, county, city, township, or special district governments.

Funding: \$6 million; awards up to \$300,000.

Funding: Total unlisted; awards up to \$2 million.
