Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students Fund Reporting

On March 27, 2020, the President of the United States signed the CARES Act (H.R. 748), which provides emergency relief funds to organizations and individuals affected by the coronavirus pandemic. The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF), found in Section 18004 of the CARES Act, provides funding to institutions of higher education "to prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus."

This report provides details on the first award Western Illinois University received under the HEERF, the funds for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Award No. P425E200622.

CERTIFICATION

Western Illinois University signed and returned to the US Department of Education the Certification and Agreement on April 13, 2020. On April 28, 2020 WIU received notification of grant funding from the Department of Education. WIU will use no less than 50% of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. Western Illinois University will receive a total of \$7,997,093 under Section 18004(a)(1) of the HEERF. At least \$3,998,547 will be distributed directly to students impacted by campus disruptions due to the Coronavirus.

FUNDS DISTRIBUTED

As of 8/24/2020, WIU has awarded \$3,808,468 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

Western Illinois University has an estimated 8,118 students eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. As of 08/24/20, WIU has distributed Emergency Financial Aid Grants to 3,353 students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act.

METHOD USED TO DETERMINE STUDENTS ELIGIBILITY (FALL 2020)

Emergency aid is given out in the form of a grant and need not be repaid. These emergency funds are administered as one-time awards and are not to be used for a current account balance. The fund can be used to meet a short-term financial need but is not designed to replace or supplement financial aid. Funding is made possible through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund via the CARES Act.

To be eligible* for emergency aid students must:

- 1) A US Citizen or eligible non-citizen.
- 2) Be enrolled for the term in which funds are being requested.
- 3) Admitted into a degree program.
- 4) Meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress

Students will be identified for emergency grants based on two factors: Pell eligibility and receipt of book award(s) during the 2019-20 AY.

- Returning students: Students who were awarded a Freshmen Book Award (807.04) will receive a CARES grant in the amount of \$600 Fall 2020.
- New transfer students: Using the criteria of the Leatherneck Book Award new transfer students will receive a CARES grant in the amount of \$600 Fall 2020.
- Remaining funds will be awarded based on receipt of a Parent/Student income appeal. The amount will be determined by the Committee on Professional Judgment (CPJ) for no more than the maximum 20-21 PELL Grant.

- 4. If you have not filed your 2020-21 FAFSA we encourage you to do so now to avoid missing out on valuable State funds.
- 5. To register for the Fall 2020 semester your account balance must be below \$3000. If it is, we encourage you to register and lock in your Fall 2020 schedule.

Notification to students awarded emergency aid:

Grants have been made using a student's 2019-20 and 2020-21 Pell eligibility. **You have been awarded a \$600 grant for the Fall 2020 term**. If you withdraw from the university or drop all of your hours prior to the 10th day of the semester (September 4, 2020) you may be required to repay these funds. These funds are separate from any Title IV Funds (i.e. Federal Pell Grant, Federal Direct Loans) you may be receiving/expecting as a refund. The earliest Title IV refunds may be issued is Friday, August 21, 2020.

Grants were applied to a student's University account Wednesday, August 12, 2020. Credits were <u>automatically</u> refunded Thursday, August 13, 2020 using the direct deposit authorization on file with Billing & Receivables. If you had not authorized direct deposit, a paper check was created Friday, August 14, 2020 and will be mailed to your home address. Please allow 10 business days for delivery.
