The 2+2 is a four-year plan that leads to a Bachelor of Music degree in Music Business at WIU.

Students intending to complete a baccalaureate degree in Music, Music Business from WIU should follow the Associate in Arts degree program with a concentration in Music, as outlined in this brochure from McHenry County College (MCC).

Students who complete the Associate in Arts degree at McHenry may transfer to WIU and complete their degree in Music Business in an additional two years.

Notes for MCC

1. Piano Competency and Theory / Aural Skills assessments will be taken prior to 5th semester at WIU. If additional training is deemed necessary, based on the skills assessment, additional coursework in theory and /or piano may be required. Only courses for which a student earned a C or better will be considered for transfer. A list of WIU competencies in both piano and theory /aural skills is available at MCC.
2. It is possible a student may start at the 400 level of applied lessons their first semester at WIU, but up to discretion of applied faculty at WIU. Transfer students may also delay audition for upper level lessons until end of 1st semester at WIU.
3. MCC requires two multicultural/ diversity course requirements. Select two courses from MCC's AA curriculum – one that also will satisfy the IAI Humanities or the IAI Social/Behavioral Science requirements. It is your responsibility to refer to MCC's catalog to ensure you satisfy all AA degree requirements.
